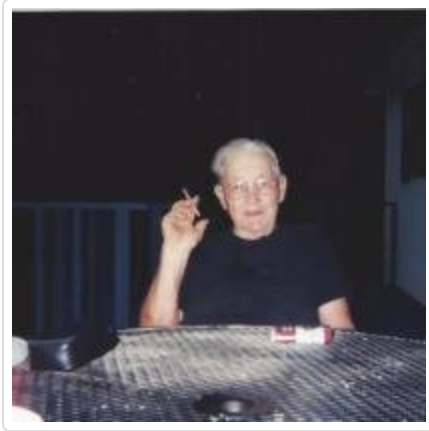




Mr. Joe Wallace Southers
