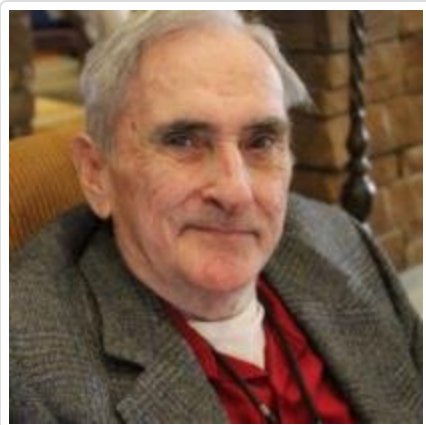




Mr. Victor Joseph Held

Victor Joseph Held of Grant, AL was born May 8, 1947, in Rockville Centre, NY, and departed this life June 3, 2022, at age of 75 due to medical complications.
